"4 Day Festival of Woodcarving"

GMWC August Show & Sale at Birds of Vermont Museum

Saturday, August 23, 2025

In 2023, we reached a milestone, with our 50th Annual August Show and Sale at the Rusty Parker Park in downtown Waterbury Vermont. To celebrate our next 50, we decided to move the Annual Show to the Birds of Vermont Museum. As we are already doing our 3 day class there just before the Show, this has sort of created a "4 day Festival of WoodCarving". The move was very successful, and all decided this we wanted to continue for 2025. To meet some scheduling issues our Show this year will be held on Saturday, August 23, 2025. This is a good opportunity to get together with fellow carvers, show your work, and get more people interested in woodcarving. We can think of our Annual Show as a large outdoor CarveIn where we invite the public to join us. Please mark your calendars and plan on joining us to celebrate our 52nd year of our Annual Public Carving Show. Don't have a canopy or table for the outdoor Show? No problem, we have some to share. As the Show is right after the August class, its also a good time to see the progress on the Herons. For those in the class a time to fine tune the project and start some painting.

August 20-22, 2025

3 Day Carving Class:

Scale Great Blue Heron w/ Matthew and Bob

This years 3 Day August Carving Class will be a scale Great Blue Heron. Like the Swan and the Mallard the Heron can be carved in a variety of styles from a simple folk art style to a fully feathered and painted Heron, depending on what each carver wants to do. Plus due to its size, the class is suitable for both novice and more experienced carvers. Like the Mallard, Matt will be the instructor, and Bob will be covering texturing and painting. The project can be completed using mainly a knife and palm size tools. We had a painted prototype for members to look over at the April CarveIn, and will again have it at the May CarveIn at Birds of VT. The cost of the class will be \$125 in addition a small material fee will be collected at the class to cover the cost of the blank and supplies. Registration is a bit different this year, checks need to be made out to the Birds of Vermont Museum and sent to Barb Taylor as well as letting Matt



know you are signing up so we have enough blanks ready. The class will be limited to 10 participants, so please sign up early to reserve your spot. At the June CarveIn, we are already at about 7 signed up and paid, so don't wait till the last minute to reserve your spot.

May 10th, 2025 CarveIn Report

Host: Birds Of Vermont Museum- Huntington, VT

Our May Carve-In was hosted by the Birds of Vermont Museum in Huntington.. Once again, May forgot to bring Flowers and brought rain again, a good excuse to spend early summer day carving. Magee is a long brown building diagonally across from Tire Warehouse. Look for a huge granite sign-post in front of the building, as well as GMWC Carve-In signs. Park in the lot on the left.
