3 Day Carving Class- August 20th - 22nd

Carving a Scale Great Blue Heron w/ Matthew Strong & Bob Lindemann

This year's 3 Day August Carving Class will be a scale Great Blue Heron. Like the Swan and the Mallard the Heron can be carved in a variety of styles from a simple folk art style to a fully feathered and painted Heron, depending on what each carver wants to do. Plus due to its size, the class is suitable for both novice and more experienced carvers. Like the Mallard, Matt will be the instructor, and Bob will be covering texturing and painting. The project can be completed using mainly a knife and palm size tools. We had a painted prototype for members to look over at the April CarveIn, and will again have it at the May CarveIn at Birds of VT. The cost of the class will be \$125 in addition a small material fee will be collected at the class to cover the cost of the blank and supplies. Registration is a bit different this year, checks need to be made out to the Birds of Vermont Museum and sent to Barb Taylor as well as letting Matt know you are signing up so we have enough blanks ready. The class will be limited to 10 participants, so please sign up early to reserve your spot.

March 2025 Carve-In Report:
